

**Quilt**

**Items you will need for a twin size quilt:**

- 5 yds white on white print fabric for quilt squares
- 2 yds green fabric for the border
- 3 yds blue fabric for the lettering and squares around the flowerpot
- 1 yd brown fabric for the flowerpot
- 11 yds for the support fabric on the quilt squares
- 11 yds ½" loft quilt batting
- 5¼ yds for the backing
- ¾ yd for the binding
- Chalk wheel or pencil
- Quilt pins
- Use ½" seam to assemble the quilt.

2. Hoop the three pieces with the support fabric on the bottom.
3. Embroider the design. Repeat to finish squares of each design needed for quilt.
4. When moving the hoop leave a 1" space between the stitch lines for the ½" seams. (Strongly recommend tracing the design to make sure you have the designs spaced 1" apart for ½" seams.)



**To embroider quilt squares:**

1. Layer top (quilt square) fabric, batting in the middle, and the support fabric on the bottom.



5. Cut squares, ½" on the outside of the stitch lines.



**To assemble the quilt:**

1. Lay the quilt squares out in order. See layout on last page.
2. Stitch the squares together. Row 1 starting with square A. Repeat until all rows are stitched.
3. Press each seam to the opposite sides; Row 1 (repeat all rows with odd numbers), first seam to the left, second seam to the right, third seam to the left, etc. Row 2 (repeat all rows with even numbers), first seam to the right, second seam to the left, third seam to the right, etc.



4. Stitch the rows together.
5. Press seams as shown.



6. Lay the backing with the front side down then lay the quilt side up on top of the backing. Pin the top and backing of the quilt together, pinning the corners together will hold the seam intersections as pressed.

7. Stitch in the ditch.
8. Trim the backing to the same size of the quilt top.
9. Cut fabric for binding; 3½" x the length of the fabric. Fold in half the long way, press. The fabric does not need to be cut on the bias because it is used on straight edges. Bind the outside edges.

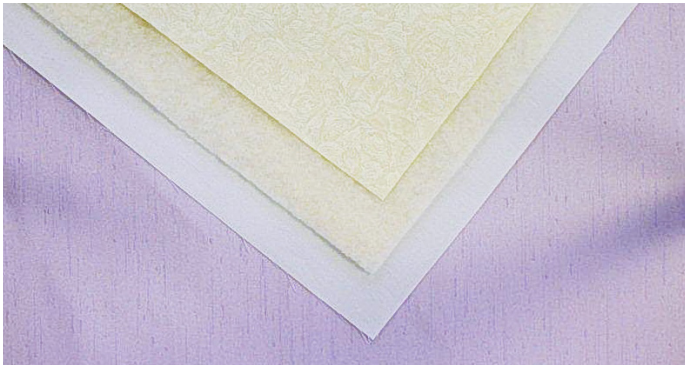
**Quilt Pillowcase**

**Items you will need:**

- ¼ yd ½" loft quilt batting
- ¼ yd white on white print fabric for three flower quilt squares
- 6" X 16" green fabric for the two accent quilt squares
- ¼ yd for the support fabric on the quilt squares
- 1 yd blue fabric for the pillowcase
- Quilt pins
- Use ½" seam to assemble the pillowcase.

**To embroider quilt squares:**

1. Layer top (quilt square) fabric, batting in the middle, and the support fabric on the bottom.



2. Hoop the three pieces with the support fabric on the bottom.
3. Embroider the design. Repeat to finish squares of each design needed for quilt.
4. When moving the hoop leave a 1" space between the stitch lines for the ½" seams. (Strongly recommend tracing the design to make sure you have the designs spaced 1" apart for ½" seams.)



5. Cut squares, ½" on the outside of the stitch lines.



**To assemble the pillow case:**

1. Cut the blue fabric: one 23" X 42", two 21" X 6", and one 42½" X 5".
2. Lay the quilt squares in desired pattern.
3. Stitch the embroidered squares together. Press seams.
4. Lay one 21" X 6" piece of fabric and the quilt squares front sides up matching the edges. Pin. Stitch in the ditch.
5. Place the 21" X 6" piece of fabric and the quilt squares front sides together. Pin. Stitch one short side together.
6. Stitch the front side of the quilt squares piece on the long side of the 23" X 42" piece of fabric with front sides together.
7. Fold the 21" X 6" piece of fabric with front side out; stitch the long sides of the piece of fabric to the quilt squares piece of fabric.
8. Stitch side and top of pillowcase.

Note: If you do not serge your seams, zigzag your raw edges to prevent fraying.



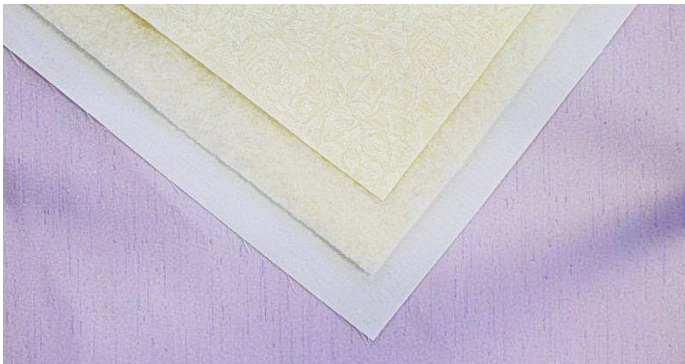
**Quilt Wall Hanging**

**Items you will need:**

- 1 yd ½" loft quilt batting
- ½ yd white on white print fabric for the flower squares
- ¼ yd green fabric for the quilt squares, backing, and binding
- 1 yd for the support fabric on the quilt squares
- Quilt pins
- ½" plastic rings
- ¼ " wood dowel
- Use ½" seam to assemble the wall hanging.

**To embroider quilt squares:**

1. Layer top (quilt square) fabric, batting in the middle, and the support fabric on the bottom.



2. Hoop the three pieces with the support fabric on the bottom.
3. Embroider the design. Repeat to finish squares of each design needed for quilt.
4. When moving the hoop leave a 1" space between the stitch lines for the ½" seams. (Strongly recommend tracing the design to make sure you have the designs spaced 1" apart for ½" seams.)



5. Cut squares, ½" on the outside of the stitch lines



**To assemble the wall hanging:**

1. Lay the quilt squares out in desired pattern.
2. Stitch the squares together. Row 1 starting with square A. Repeat until all rows are stitched.
3. Press each seam to the opposite sides; Row 1 (repeat all rows with odd numbers), first seam to the left, second seam to the right, third seam to the left, etc. Row 2 (repeat all rows with even numbers), first seam to the right, second seam to the left, third seam to the right, etc.



4. Stitch the rows together.

5. Press seams as shown.



6. Lay the backing with the front side down and the quilt side up on top. Pin the top and backing of the quilt together. Pin corners to hold the seam intersections as pressed.

7. Stitch in the ditch.

8. Trim the backing to the same size of the quilt.

9. Bind the outside edge.

10. Stitch the plastic rings to the back so you can hang the mini-quilt.
