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Dies Needed:

GO! Butterfly-Pieced-9" Finished (55598) GO! Strip Cutter-5" (4-1/2" Finished) (55023)

GO! Strip Cutter-2-1/2" (2" Finished) (55017 or 55014)

Cutting Directions:

Fabric Color	Die	Number of Shapes to Cut
Black	GO! Strip Cutter- 5" (4-1/2" Finished) (55023)	CUT 8 – 5-1/2" WOF Strips Place no more than 6 layers at a time and cut all strips.
		SubCUT as follows:
		6 – 36-1/2" strips 6 – 9-1/2" strips 4 – Squares (place remaining strip on 90° line on die board and cut 4 squares
6 Assorted colors	GO! Butterfly- Pieced-9" Finished (55598) SHAPES A & B	FOLD each of the 11" X 11" fabric pieces in half. Place 3 folded pieces at a time over shapes A & B and cut. Repeat with remaining colors. Each color will have: SHAPE A - 1 left & 1 right facing SHAPE B - 1 left & 1 right facing The cut pieces will be enough to make 12 butterflies. Only 9 are used for this pattern.
Black	GO! Butterfly- Pieced-9" Finished (55598) SHAPES C, D, E, F	CUT 5 – 8" WOF Strips SubCUT into 5" X 8" rectangles. Place 6 layers at a time over shapes C, D, E & F and cut. Repeat 2 more times for a total of 18 cuts.
		Total per shape: Shape C - 18 Shape D - 36 Shape E - 36 Shape F - 18
Black	GO! Butterfly- Pieced-9" Finished (55598) SHAPE G	CUT 9 shapes from the leftover fabric from above.





Sewing Tips & Directions: Use a ¹/₄ seam allowance.

Make the Butterfly Blocks 9" Finished Block Make 9 Blocks


Be sure to follow the order of assembly! It will make the piecing easy and quick.

The diagram to the right will show the placement of shapes based on the colors we are using for this pattern.

You can use the same color combinations I used or create your own!


Do not worry about which colors to combine to

create your butterflies until after you have sewn the A & B sections to the background pieces. Once these are assembled you can mix and match!










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Assembling the Quilt Top:

- 1. This Quilt is a large 9 with sashing rows in between.
- 2. SEW 3 butterfly blocks and 2 5" X 9-1/2" rectangles together to make a ROW
- 3. Repeat with remaining butterfly blocks and rectangles. MAKE 3 ROWs



- 4. SEW 4 Black 5" X 36-1/2" strips to the butterfly rows. One on the top, one on the bottom and one between each of the butterfly rows.
- 5. SEW 1- 5" square to either side of the 2 remaining 5" X 36-12" strips, then sew these strips to either side of the quilt top.





Assembly TIPS:

Press all the seams to the solid black rectangles when sewing the butterfly blocks into rows. Press all the seams to the long black sashing strips when sewing the rows together.

Press your quilt top from the back side making sure you press the seams in the direction you have sewn them. Turn the quilt over and press again from the front.

Quilting and Finishing

- 1. Layer batting between quilt top and backing.
- 2. Pin or baste layers together.
- 3. Quilt as desired.
- 4. Add Binding
